We're excited to let you know that we've invested in new computing equipment to support and enhance learning across the school. Thirty brand-new devices will be used in class-based computing lessons, alongside fantastic resources for coding, 3D modelling, and game design.

Our Year 4, 5 and 6 children will also benefit from one-to-one devices in class, helping them learn in new ways, access additional support where needed, and present their learning creatively. We want to reassure families that technology will be used to enrich learning – not replace it – and pen-and-paper skills remain a vital part of our curriculum.

Staff are working closely with colleagues across our Trust and Tablet Academy to ensure everyone feels confident and ready to make the most of this brilliant opportunity. Exciting things await!

- making and maintaining friendships.

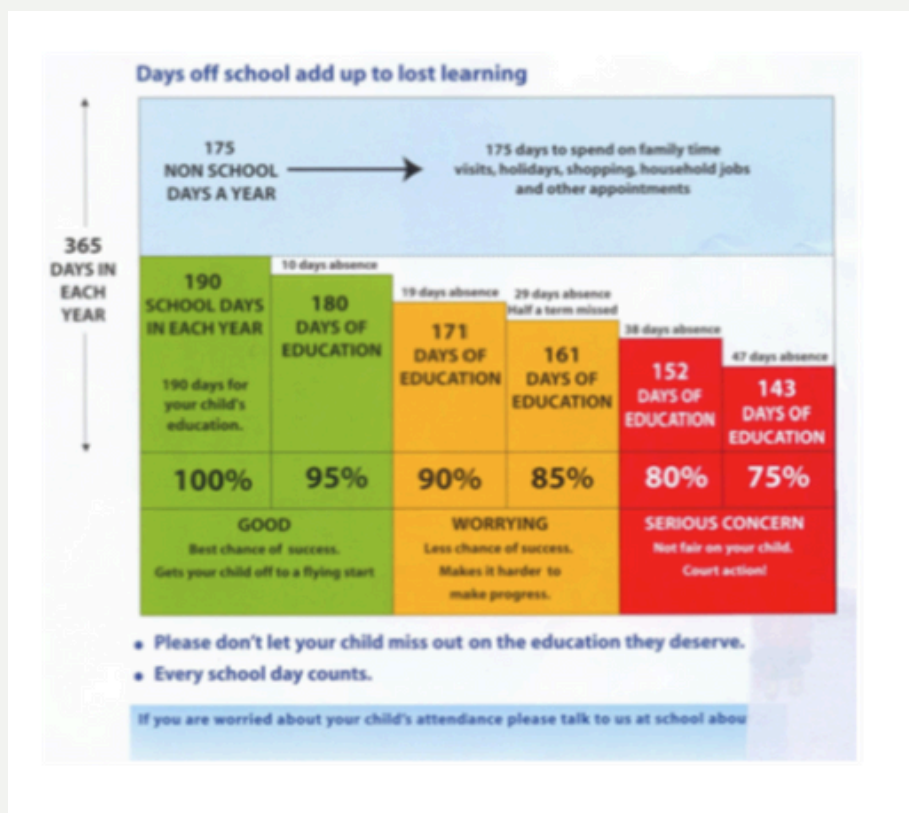
Our target attendance is 96% - Here is how you can help your children and our school to achieve this!

- Be on time - school gates and doors open at 8.45am and are closed promptly at 9.00am when learning begins. If your child arrives after 9.00am they will receive a late mark and you must enter school via the school office and speak to our attendance officer (Mrs Townsend). Any late arrival after this time must come to the school office to explain the reason for lateness.
- Please ensure that non-urgent appointments (e.g. routine dental/medical) are made out of school times where possible. If this is unavoidable, please provide copies of appointment letters/ cards to the school office.
- Do not book holidays in term time, in line with the Government ruling, we are unable to authorise holidays and penalty notices and fines will be issued by Trafford Local Authority. School Safety



Please can I ask all parents NOT to park on the yellow lines outside the front of school. The lines are there to ensure that our children and their families can cross the road safely. Parking is available at George H Carnell across the road from school.

If you have a blue disabled parking badge, please can you contact the school office so that we can notify the parking officers within the Local Authority.

I am aware that drop-off in the morning can be stressful and sometimes we can run late but PLEASE do not park on the lines and compromise the safety of our children. Members of staff will be on the school gate each morning to welcome the children into school and to ensure that the road is clear, please can I ask that you are respectful and polite to staff if approached about parking.
